Six Ways to Stay Safe When Working on Cranes in Marine Terminals

1 Turn off, de-energize, and lockout and tagout all power sources before servicing.



2 Identify confined spaces on cranes and follow safety precautions when entering.



3 Wear fall protection when working on elevated surfaces outside the crane's cab.



4 Know the locations of pinch points and crushing hazards.



5 Be aware of vehicle traffic patterns and conduct work in a protected area.



6 Maintain clear and open radio communication with crane operators.
